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## New Landscaping at the Kitchen

A landscaping project had been a dream of the Parish Kitchen staff since the relocation in July 2020. We envisioned a peaceful and tranquil courtyard setting for our guests to enjoy during their visits. Our hope was that this beautification project would allow our guests to leave their troubles at the gate and allow nature to help free them from their worries and concerns, if just for the time they were with us. Previously, guests walked through the gates into a sparse area of dirt and rocks. There was a meager amount of grass that grew on the uneven ground, straight into the side door where guests were welcomed. During serving time at the Parish Kitchen, the line often backed up on the sidewalk into the side yard.

Now, a beautiful gift has been bestowed at the Parish Kitchen, compliments of our special donors (Emilie Dressler and The Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Garden) and unwavering volunteers (Steve Foltz, Tom & Mary Schutzman and famiy, Lisa Arlinghaus, Tom Rawe, George Geraci and Jorja Kremer) who braved the heat and created a gorgeous oasis for our guests.

Our volunteer landscape manager for this project just happened to be Steve Foltz, the Director of Horticulture for the Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Garden. We asked Mr. Foltz to come out and look at our grounds and explained to him what we imagined. After a few more visits, he sketched a drawing of what he envisioned for the yard.
