Parish Kitchen officially opened its doors to dine-in service on June 1, allowing guests who had been receiving take-out meals the past 14 months during the pandemic the opportunity to experience first-hand the warmth of food and fellowship inside our new location.

Guests enjoyed relaxing in the bright new space, while eating the first dine-in meal on the menu: cheesy chicken casserole with vegetables, warm bread and a delicious dessert. Volunteers, some of whom had not see each other since the pandemic began, shared (masked) hugs and served up lunch to guests with their familiar, friendly smiles. "It's so nice to be back," was the shared sentiment of volunteers.

Guests approved whole-heartedly of the new space. "The atmosphere is so much better here; we are not crammed in," commented Debbie, who was also a regular guest at the former location. "We feel like we are on a picnic or a grillout with all of our friends and family," shared another guest, Kelly. "We feel wanted here," she added. "We don't feel degraded."

A welcoming, nonjudgmental atmosphere is at the heart of Parish Kitchen's ministry. "It feels more dignified to offer a clean, warm, welcoming space to serve our guests," said Parish Kitchen Manager Maria Meyer. "When the guests dine in, we have an opportunity to get to know them better and offer more hospitality and attention. It feels like this vital part of our ministry was missing during the pandemic. I am thrilled to reopen this beautiful space for our guests."

Parish Kitchen moved to its new location at 16th and Madison in Covington in July 2020 amid COVID-19 guarantines and safety protocols that prevented opening its doors for inside dining. Earlier, in March 2020, the staff and volunteers switched seamlessly to carry-out service without missing a single day of providing lunch. An estimated 9,000 additional meals have been served during the pandemic.

As we ease out of COVID-19 restrictions, Parish Kitchen will continue to offer guests the option of a takeout meal if they are uncomfortable dining in. We will also continue to monitor future developments from the CDC and the local health department to ensure that we are doing everything possible to provide a safe space for our guests.

St. Elizabeth Health Ministries, which has provided vital health screenings at Parish Kitchen during the pandemic, will continue to offer screenings to our guests weekly. What's more, exciting progress is being realized on the future garden on the side yard, where volunteers have been laboring this spring to build raised beds to grow fresh vegetables and herbs that will be incorporated into meals for our guests.
