## A Big Thank You From Pickett's Corner

As we wrap up another year at Pickett's Corner, a ministry of Catholic Charities, we want to share the impact we've made together with your support. Since launching in July 2023, we've distributed 747 bikes and locks to individuals across three counties in Northern Kentucky and Cincinnati, OH. Our motto, "Donate a bike and change a life," is backed by a 2015 Harvard University study that found access to affordable transportation is crucial for escaping poverty and preventing homelessness. This has been echoed by our bike recipients, who share how their new bikes make commuting to work, attending doctor's appointments, and improving their daily lives much easier.

Here are two of the many inspiring stories we've heard:

One gentleman returned from a clinic visit and shared that he had been taken off some of his medications. When asked what had changed, he proudly replied, "They gave me this bike, and I take it everywhere I go!"

Another recipient brought his bike in for repairs after wearing out the wheel bearings while delivering for UberEats. We set him up with a new bike and luggage rack to help him carry more. He told us this bike is essential for his livelihood.

Thanks to the generous donations of bicycles from people throughout the diocese and funding from grants, we've been able to keep this initiative going.

Jim Volz, an advisory board member and team leader at Pickett's Corner, expressed, "As we take a break for the winter, we want to extend our heartfelt thanks for your support of our bike ministry. # The Gift of Volunteers By: James Wendeln, Parish Kitchen Manager


We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks and deepest appreciation to all the volunteers
