A Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

I'm excited to share that this fall marks the beginning of something extraordinary for Catholic school students in our diocese. Beginning with the 2025–2026 school year, Catholic Charities will launch CARES—the Catholic Approach to Resilience, Engagement, and Support—at Holy Cross, Holy Trinity, and Mary Queen of Heaven elementary schools. This pilot program will serve all 400



students at no cost to schools or families, reflecting our deep commitment to ensuring that every child in our care is seen, valued, and supported not only in academics but also in their emotional and spiritual growth. At the same time, we are pleased to provide mental health counseling to two new schools – Immaculate Heart of Mary, Burlington, and St. Peter& Paul, California.

The decision to expand our services and launch CARES was shaped directly by the feedback of our Catholic school partners. In May 2024, Catholic Charities surveyed all Catholic elementary and high schools in the Diocese. The survey had a twofold purpose: first, to gain a clear picture of the current landscape of mental health counseling services available in our schools; and second, to identify opportunities for strengthening and expanding those services in preparation for the 2025–2026 school year. 29 of 36 schools (an 80.5% response rate), and the message was clear: schools want more counseling support but face limited resources. The details of CARES and the call to action it inspired are described in the article *Made in the Image and Likeness of God* by Karen Kuhlman (pages 4-5).

Together, the launch of CARES and the expansion of our counseling program represent an important step forward in our mission to walk with children and families in their journey of faith and learning. We are building a system that strengthens not only academics, but also resilience, compassion, and hope—qualities that shape the whole person. In this way, Catholic Charities is helping our schools prepare students not only for success in the classroom, but for lives of faith, hope, and love—lives firmly rooted in Christ.

To prepare for this new initiative, Catholic Charities has welcomed Holly Barrett-Sears, Jessica Gangwish and Justin Voight, who will provide expertise and guidance. They will collaborate with school counseling supervisor Sheila Dumford (Mary Queen of Heaven and Holy Cross Elementary) and Michelle Barbian (Holy Spirit Elementary). Together, this team will ensure that CARES is carefully tailored to the needs of each school community while staying firmly grounded in our Catholic mission.

With the help of tutoring, 12 of the children completed the Kenton County library's summer reading challenge. In total, over 178 books were read this summer by the children at St. Joseph. We are thrilled to watch their continued growth throughout the upcoming school year.

Made in the Image and Likeness of God

Little by little, the days grow shorter, and we welcome the cooler temperatures that usher in the beauty of Autumn. The rhythm of family life shifts as the laid-back days of summer give way to busy school schedules. Summer wardrobes are replaced with school-friendly clothing, and children transform into students settling in with new teachers, making friends, and learning new things each day.

Their efforts are joined by teachers and support personnel who strive daily to achieve a common goal: "Let us make this the best school year ever!" Sharing that commitment is Chris Goddard, Executive Director of Catholic Charities in the Diocese of Covington, a position he assumed in May 2024. Before joining Catholic Charities, he spent four years teaching at Notre Dame Academy and Seton High Schools, where he saw firsthand the importance of Christian-rooted counseling in supporting students' growth. That experience informs his vision for expanding Catholic Charities' school counseling program and strengthening services that nurture students' emotional and spiritual well-being.



Just as the school year brings new routines and opportunities, it also highlights the need for support for all students. Historically, Catholic Charities provided intensive, one-on-one mental health counseling for the 3–5% of students with the greatest needs. While essential for those students, the remaining 95–97% had limited access to preventative and universal support.

Surveys conducted by Catholic Charities in 2024 across all diocesan schools, combined with research into national best practices, guided the development of CARES—the Catholic Approach to Resilience, Engagement, and Support. CARES provides counseling for all students while ensuring intensive support for those with the greatest needs.

CARES addresses the needs of the entire school community, ensuring that all children have access to care while providing deeper interventions for those who need them most. By building on the experience of educators and evidence-based clinical best practices, Catholic Charities and school partners will create a model that is practical, sustainable, and adaptable, yet firmly rooted in the Catholic mission. Through a tiered or layered approach, CARES will move beyond a one-size-fits-all model to a comprehensive system that respects the dignity and value of every child.

The multi-tiered structure includes: Tier 1 offers school-wide programming to foster resilience, healthy relationships, and a positive learning environment; Tier 2 provides small-group, targeted interventions for students needing additional guidance; and Tier 3 delivers individualized counseling for students facing more intensive challenges. By combining universal, targeted, and intensive support, CARES strives to ensure that every child benefits from both preventative care and focused interventions.

This fall, CARES will launch at Holy Cross, Holy Trinity, and Mary Queen of Heaven schools, reaching over 400 students. Because each school has unique needs, CARES will be developed collaboratively with school leaders, teachers, counselors, and parents to ensure the program fits each of the three communities.

"This approach is unique," Goddard says. "As a Catholic organization, we bring a deep understanding of the human person, made in the image and likeness of God. Our role goes beyond addressing challenges like bullying or anxiety—we aim to prepare students for success in the classroom and in life, through a lens of faith, resilience, and hope."

Catholic Charities provides a distinct and comprehensive service that supports not only students but also parents, teachers, and school leaders. By grounding counseling in a Catholic understanding of the human person, the program helps students flourish academically, emotionally, and spiritually, equipping them to live out their faith with confidence and purpose.

Pickett's Corner: A Ministry on the Move

Over the past three years, Pickett's Corner—through the support of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Covington—has repaired and distributed more than 1,000 bicycles to individuals in need of basic transportation for work,



medical appointments, and essential errands. While the numbers are significant, it is the personal stories, shared one by one, that reveal the heart of this ministry. Many recipients return to our site at 15th and Madison simply to say thank you and to share how their lives have changed.

"I no longer need to take my medicine because I had improved so much. I take this bike everywhere."

"I got a job delivering Uber Eats using the bike you gave me. I wore out the tires. You fixed it up with a new rack and new tires. I'm still rolling."

"I've used my bike to help me recover from ACL surgery. It's the perfect transportation. I ride it 5 to 10 miles every day."

There is nothing complicated or bureaucratic about Pickett's Corner. It operates with simplicity and purpose, rooted in a call to love our neighbor. Most of the volunteers are retirees who enjoy biking and repairing bikes, but above all, they find joy in helping others and living out their faith. All are welcomed with dignity and compassion, and while bikes are given freely, we hold sincere expectations of gratitude and responsible stewardship from each recipient.
